No need to fear because many of the materials can be purchased on a budget or found already in the house. This list is a compilation of the activities performed in our Project Learning Tree workshop and from the Project Learning Tree K-12 curriculum guide. Each checklist contains materials that can be purchased for one dollar or less at the local dollar tree or dollar general. Many of the items may be recycled from the home or collected from your own backyard. Finally the checklist has the page number listed so that each facilitator would need to complete the activity as described by the guide. Note the amounts needed on the checklist are enough for each participant unless otherwise stated!

Act. 5 pg. 31

- Paper
- Pencils
- Pens
- Crayon
- Clipboard or heavy box board with paperclips

Living with Fire Act. 81 pg. 231

- Tealight or old candle
- Baby food jar (small glass jar)
- Lighter
- Craft lace
- Construction paper
- Hole punch
- Pony beads

Renewable or Not

Act 14 pg. 38

Part A:

- Pencils
- Pens
- Paper

Part B:

- Various candy (need 56 pieces)
- Clothesline rope
- Paper plates

Birds & Worms

Act 25 Pg.111

- Colored pasta (you need at least 3-4 colors)
- Markers
- Pens
- Pencils
- Paper
- Poster
- Old photos of camouflaged animals

Note: Pasta is biodegradable if all pieces aren't collected. Be aware of any allergies that you may have in your group.
